KIDS LEARN THROUGH PLAY AT THE LIBRARY

Some things change, some stay the same with youth services at the library.

Look into the community room during Tuesday Playgroup with volunteer Mary Cleary or during Wednesday Storytime and you'll find an active group of preschoolers and their caregivers playing and socializing. Coordinated Family and Community Engagement (CFCE) grant money has provided a great variety of plastic blocks, animals and vehicles that get spread all over the rug - not to mention the sand table and small puppet theater that make occasional appearances.

The LEGO Club starts up again in March. It's a month long Tuesday after-school series for elementary school kids with help from parent volunteers.

Many libraries are now offering coding programs to demystify computer science. Lynn and volunteer Dale Kasal are developing family coding opportunities for families in Westhampton - the first one was held at the HRHS Library. Related books on coding will be added to our shelves.

The library offers at least one children's program a week for six weeks each summer. The Friends funded the most popular Summer 2016 children's program - live ani-

mals from around the world presented by Creature Teachers. This coming summer, Dinoman will fill the community room with huge inflatable dinosaurs and dinosaur fossils, thanks to donations designated for the Friends' Lyn Keating Programming Fund.

Picture books, graphic novels and DVDs currently circulate quite actively in the juvenile collection. We respond to local interest in our selection of materials. You can help us by giving feedback on what your children like to check out.

We want to thank long-time library volunteers Lorraine O'Keefe, Sheila Marks, Helene Pajak, Victoria Yoshen and Ellice Gonzalez. We also welcome new volunteers Dan Parker and Angela Griefen. We appreciate your skills and your volunteerism!
