Helpful Research Notes:

LDS Microfilm = Microfilm made from the original books/records of towns by members of the Church of the Latter Day Saints (more commonly referred to as the Mormon Church. Copies of microfilm may be ordered from them to be delivered to and read at a nearby LDS Library of your choice. The website: www.familysearch.org is also maintained by the LDS.

Forbes Library, located on Rte 66 (a.k.a. "West Street") in Northampton, MA, houses the largest collection of Hampshire County local history/genealogy/maps. The various resources are located in the Hampshire Room (Archive) and the first floor.

Microfilm resources include: newspapers, historic local town atlases, Samuel Wright's History of Westhampton, Enoch Hale's Diary (Westhampton portion) as copied by Sylvester Judd, Sylvester Judd Manuscripts, U.S. Census. Microfilm is housed on the first floor.

Most town/county maps can be viewed (and printed) from microfilm, see above. However, county and town maps, including the 1795 first survey of town is referred to as the *Denniston map of Westhampton* are housed in the Hampshire Room. A copy of the *Denniston*

map of Westhampton can be purchased directly from the Massachusetts State Archives for \$10.00. (Note: this map only shows early roads, mills, streams and hills – no homesteads or family names.)

Family histories and town histories are located on the first floor.

Volumes of War Veteran information for those who served from Hampshire County are on the first floor. In addition, the Forbes Library staff collected news items on local WWI and WWII servicemen/women. This collection includes individual service member files and scrapbooks featuring the war and local home front efforts. These are located in the Hampshire Room.

The Corbin index cards listing all those buried in the Westhampton Center Cemetery are located in the Hampshire Room.

An index to Westhampton news items/obits published in the *Hampshire Gazette* between 1786-1878 is located in the Hampshire Room. Printed and cd available for use. Index cards of mid-1900s Westhampton items are in wooden cabinet on the first floor.

Westhampton Museum & Blacksmith Shop, 5 Stage Rd., Westhampton, is maintained by the town's Historical Commission and is staffed by volunteers. Artifacts, large collection of 19th century tools, clothing, photographs, copies of town reports, history/minutes of defunct town organizations such as the Men's Club, etc. Afternoon hours 2-4 Sunday afternoons between Memorial Day and mid-Oct. or call the current Historical Commission President per the town website www.westhampton-ma.com or contact the Town Clerk.

Enoch Hale's Diary, "Westhampton Years" – Beginning p. 8 of Hale's diary. These are <u>extracts</u> chosen and *transcribed by Sylvester Judd, Esq.* (Microfilm Reel #15-C Judd Manuscripts at Forbes Library. Rev. Hale's diary includes entries prior to the town's incorporation in 1778, prior to the erection of any 'meeting house', etc. Mentions deaths, burials, weddings, sermons, his own travel, the establishment of his home and life in Westhampton, town meetings/decisions, daily life in town, agriculture, hiring and purchases, etc.—(The original diary resides at Yale University, New Haven, CT.)

Sylvester Judd's Notebook No. 3 "Westhampton Years" (The original notebook resides at Forbes Library Local History Room and has been transcribed by Barbara Pelissier, Westhampton)

Hampshire County Hall of Records, 33 King Street, Northampton, houses Probate Records on the 2nd floor and Land Records on the 1st floor. There is a metal detector as you enter the building, as it is also a Probate Courthouse. In the Registry of Deeds, you may order deeds and/or maps to be copied for you. Probate records that are very old are delicate and may not be copied. They may be photographed, however. Ask the Registrar of Probate for clearance. For all newer records, there is a coin operated copy machine for your use on the second floor where the files are kept. Bring plenty of quarters for the copier!
